- There are well over 300 varieties of honey in the United States, as the color and flavor of honey depends on the nectar source; and WHEREAS.
- The benefits of honey are numerous, and honey can be used as an ingredient in food, medicine, hygiene products, and other products; and WHEREAS,
- Clarkson, Kentucky, is home to one of the largest manufacturers of beekeeping supplies in the nation; and WHEREAS,
- The month of September features two long-running bee-themed festivals in the state, the Breathitt County Honey Festival and the Clarkson Honeyfest, which has been named the "Official State Honey Festival of Kentucky"; and WHEREAS,
- Kentucky Honey Month is an opportunity to acknowledge the work of those harvesting honey and the value of honey to Kentucky; WHEREAS,
